

MAT PROGRAM

Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) is one of the most effective evidenced-based treatments for opioid addiction and opioid use disorder.

What type of program is this?

This program is set up to address both medical and addiction services under one roof. Our treatment team consists of a Licensed Independent Social Worker, Recovery Counselor, Case Manager, Nurse Practitioner, and Medical Doctor.

Are you eligible?

- Must be 18 years or older.
- Must have Opioid Use Disorder or Alcohol Use Disorder.
- Must have Medicaid (or be eligible for Medicaid)
- Cannot have active prescription for Benzodiazepine or Barbiturates.
- Those interested in service do not have to detox prior to initiating services.
- Willing to provide accurate information for continuity of care.
- Willingness to actively participate in treatment.

FDA Approved Medications Being Offered?

- Buprenorphine/naloxone (Suboxone)
- Naltrexone (Vivitrol)
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How to get started?

- Referrals can be made directly by contacting The Health Center reception and calls will be forwarded to a member of the MAT team.
- Walk-in

What you can expect when beginning treatment:

- **Pre-Screen**- by phone or in person to gather information and determine if a person is appropriate for our program.
- **Verification of Health Care Coverage**- Medicaid coverage is required prior to beginning services; assistance will be provided to those who are uninsured to obtain coverage.
- **Full Assessment**- to meet with a licensed member of the MAT team to complete intake forms, alcohol and drug assessment, and level of care.
- **Referral if necessary**- if higher level of care is needed, the client will be given alternative resources for treatment and support.

Is this a medication only program?

- Our program requires participation in behavioral health and supportive services offered by our treatment team; group counseling, individual counseling case management, and community recovery supports.
