### 2020 in review

**2020 was a year like no other** and while there were challenges to be sure, we were humbled by the outpouring of support from our donors and other partners who played a vital role in keeping our programs running at a time when they were needed most. Below are some of the changes and adaptations that occurred over the year. We are proud and extremely grateful to have been able to keep our doors open for people in need.



#### **FAITH MISSION**

- Beds were creatively spread out across dorms and common areas to achieve social distancing.
- Meals are being brought to residents to avoid congregating in the dining room, and the Community Kitchen remains temporarily closed to the public to avoid any spread.
- The Health Center started utilizing telehealth appointments.

#### LSS CHOICES

- There was an increase in the need for services as victims were trapped at home with their abusers.
- Our hotline received an increase in the number of high danger calls from police responding to domestic violence incidences.
- Due to distance learning, we ramped up our technology support, staffing, programming and activities to better accommodate the children in our shelter.

#### LSS FOOD PANTRIES

- From March June, 46% of families served have never visited our pantries before, compared to 25% the previous year.
- To minimize contact, we pre-packed food for safe, quick distribution and held food distributions outside.

#### LSS 211 CENTRAL OHIO

 As families struggled and became financially at risk, LSS 211 worked with the City of Columbus to develop the new Financial Navigator Program to help people learn budgeting skills.

#### LSS SENIOR LIVING


- To contain spread, visitation was restricted or limited at different points throughout the pandemic.
- Staff shifted strategies on how to provide creative entertainment and programming to our seniors as they shelter in place.
- We began the process of ongoing COVID testing of residents and staff.

## LSS Faith Mission

Offering a safe environment for people experiencing homelessness, LSS Faith Mission provides shelter for up to 252 men and women on an emergency basis each night. In addition to shelter, Faith Mission provides three nutritious meals a day while helping individuals with access to longer-term solutions such as permanent housing and employment assistance, as well as medical, dental, vision and behavioral health care in our health center.









### LSS CHOICES

As the only domestic violence safe haven shelter in Franklin County, LSS CHOICES for Victims of Domestic Violence offers 120 beds, a 24-hour crisis and information hotline, counseling services, support groups and legal and community advocates for those impacted by domestic violence. CHOICES staff and trained volunteers also conduct domestic violence awareness and prevention outreach throughout our community.


# LSS Food Pantries

Case managers work with clients to offer long-term solutions to increase their employment, housing and income opportunities. Additional services are provided to veterans through the emergency shelter and transitional housing program.




