President's message

I was honored to join Lutheran Social Services as CEO this year, and I am continually amazed how this organization provides some of the most critical services – health care, housing, food and shelter - in our communities. I would hate to think what it would be like if we didn't have LSS for a single day. Thanks to you, our community and clients don't have to imagine that!

Looking back over the past year, the biggest trend we are seeing is the increase in need for our services.

The affordable housing crisis continues.

Without safe, affordable housing, our clients are staying in shelter much longer. The average length of stay was up 8% at Faith Mission this fiscal year and up 13% at Faith Mission of Fairfield County. The most alarming increase was at CHOICES, which went up a staggering 60%.

Our human services programs continue to rise to meet the growing demand.

The number of people served by our LSS

Food Pantries rose 24% this fiscal year. The number of clients served at CHOICES increased 14%. And the number of times people reached out to LSS 211 is up 24% as more people look for help with utilities, rent and food pantry assistance.

Although we are seeing an increase in need while also experiencing inflation in our agency expenses, I feel confident we can continue to meet and overcome these challenges together with your investment and the support of our wonderful staff and volunteers. We appreciate your support and are grateful that you are joining our mission to create a better world while serving people in need!

Through our innovative online ordering system and multiple pantry, mobile pantry and produce distributions, the LSS Food Pantries offer a source of nourishment in 11 counties around Ohio. We remove the immediate concern of hunger in a way that honors our clients' dignity, offers hope and makes nutritious food more readily available to families and individuals who need it.









LSS Faith Mission

Offering a safe environment for individuals and veterans experiencing homelessness, LSS Faith Mission provides shelter for up to **252 men and women** on an emergency basis each night. In addition to shelter, Faith Mission provides **three nutritious meals a day** while helping individuals with access to longer-term solutions such as permanent housing and employment assistance, as well as medical, dental, vision and behavioral health care in the LSS Health Center.









LSS CHOICES

As the only domestic violence safe haven shelter in Franklin County, LSS CHOICES for Victims of Domestic Violence has **144 beds** for victims and their children, as well as a kennel for the family pet. A 24-hour crisis and information hotline, counseling services, support groups and community advocates are also available for those impacted by domestic violence.


