

Domestic violence perpetrators use economic abuse to exert power over and exploit their victims.

Economic abuse can involve using intimidation, threats, humiliation, emotional manipulation, isolation and physical violence to restrict the victim's right to work and access to property. *This includes:*



Preventing them from taking a job or forcing the victim to resign



Undermining their work performance or restricting the type of job they can do



Preventing them from accessing bank accounts



Excluding the victim from decision-making over household spending or joint property



Preventing them from accessing joint financial assets



Making them relinquish control of their property or income



Compelling them to take on the abuser's debt

This abuse sabotages the victim's independence and ability to leave the relationship by limiting access to money and work outside the home.
